



Covid-19 16-19 Tuition Fund Statement

The 16 to 19 tuition fund is a £96 million one-off fund for the 2020 to 2021 academic year only. It is ring-fenced funding for schools, colleges and all other 16 to 19 providers to support small group tuition for 16 to 19 students in English, maths, and other courses where learning has been disrupted.

Although the actual tuition does not need to be for GCSE English or Maths, the students supported all need to be those who had not achieved grade 4/5 or above in at least one of those subjects at this level by age 16.

Onslow St Audrey's School Sixth Form is eligible to receive £3,214 from this fund for small group tuition. We will be using this funding to support students who have not yet achieved a grade 4 in English and/or Maths at GCSE. We will be prioritising those students with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) where appropriate.

The funds will be used in the following way

- Small group tuition, which is in addition to their timetabled subject sessions. These sessions will be conducted by our current staff body and external credible sources if appropriate. The small group tuition objective is to maximise exam achievement by developing English and Maths skills. This tuition will be in addition to students' normal timetabled lessons and will be in groups of no more than 5.
- Bespoke support to mitigate the impact of COVID-19, this includes, but is not limited to, personal development skills, positive mental health strategies and exam preparation.
- Ensure students have access to the wealth of resources and support available online.

Onslow St Audrey's School is committed to ensuring the tuition fund is used in accordance with the Government's guidance on the 16 to 19 tuition fund by:

- Producing this statement explaining how we will use the funding in line with guidance to prioritise support for disadvantaged students.
- Publicising this statement on our website.
- Recording the use of funding, including reference to the individual students that receive the support the needs of those students, the number of hours of tuition delivered and retain the necessary evidence of the tuition provided.

- Delivering the extra tuition and spend the associated funding in the 2020-2021 academic year.
- Notify [Education and Skills Funding Agency \(ESFA\)](#) of any unspent funding from this fund in order for it to be reclaimed
